Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.

Ever since I was young, I've been intrigued with people, maps languages, foreign cultures and even the mystery of time zones. Although living near D.C. certainly explains this particular fascination, my parents have also greatly influenced my career interest. Growing up, we spent hours at the dinner table discussing the latest current events, debating the merits of public policy changes and whatever else my parents deemed important on any given day. Although I admit to initially acting bored and disinterested, as I grew older I came to appreciate these discussions.

But the experience that most influenced me occurred sophomore year at my school's annual Career Day. Rather than sit in three short, individual sessions, I opted to spend half the day listening to topics on National Security as well as the Peace Corps. Initially, I dreaded the 8:00 a.m. session, fearing long-winded explanations of some unattainable career whose specifics would blur once I walked out of the room, but as they began the presentation, I became alert. Even their first words seemed to cut straight to the core. They spoke of a love for people and a love for learning other ways of life. The idea of bringing community and information to the most remote corners of the world inspired me.

Realistically I may never join the Peace Corps; I'm not sure I have the courage to willingly march into a famine or war-ridden nation to be a first responder or a missionary for months on end. But the presentation affected me differently: it gave me courage to embrace my calling to learn other cultures and ways of life. I am driven: I know I will be involved in making the world more accessible from every corner of the earth; and am passionate about bringing change to remote areas and third world countries so that everyone is able to take full advantage of the opportunities these advancements grant us.

RECOMMENDATION FOR ALEX ROGERS

Alex Rogers in one of those students who touch people's lives and is not even aware of the impact that he makes. He lost his mother to cancer just two years ago. This loss devastated Alex, but it has reinforced the desire in him to make his life matter. In honor of his mother, Alex volunteers at the Golisono Cancer Center. He also was deeply touched by his student exchange experience in Panama and has created a program called PureDrop. Through this organization, Alex and a team of dedicated students raise funds for clean water access for villages in Panama. This group has become one of the most active groups on campus and is now even making its presence felt in our community in Northwood.

As Alex's AP English Literature instructor, I have been impressed with his work ethic. He is quiet about his success in class, but consistently earn the highest score on both tests and written essays. He paces himself in his reading for the class and in completing his work on time, even when faced with additional responsibilities at home and school. When I recently scheduled a review session after school for our midterm examination, I was surprised that Alex did not attend. One of the other students then said, "Mrs. Thornton, Alex has to work." I could not believe that this top student of mine who is also active in student government and National Honor Society along with being heavily involved with the student newspaper was also working a part-time job. I later asked Alex about this and found out that he actually was working two part-time jobs to help his father and younger sisters. Never once had I heard Alex complain about his additional responsibilities and how they may have affected his ability to prepare for class. Instead, I have always seen diligence and excellence in the work produced by Alex.

To note of his impressive resume Alex is hardly a braggart or a know-it-all, but he is no wallflower either. Alex is an energetic, engaged and honorable person of great integrity. He is that person regardless of whether anyone is watching - he is the real deal. Alex takes care of his responsibility to his studies, his family, his school, his community, and his world. I am proud of having known this young man and even prouder of the legacy that he will leave at Northwood High School.
